




Chart 6(a): Foodgrain and Horticulture Production






Chart 1 (a): Sectoral share in GVA at current prices (2011-12 series)




Chart 13 (a): Trends in Agricultural Exports and Imports




Chart 8(a): Consumption, Production and Import of Fertilizers in India





Chart 8 (b): Average Daily Wage Rate of Male & Female Field Laborers

Land & Water Resources....

- "Direct consequences of agricultural development on the environment arise from intensive farming activities, which contribute to soil erosion, land salination and loss of nutrients. The introduction of Green Revolution in the country has been accompanied by over-exploitation of land and water resources and excessive usage of fertilizers and pesticides." (SoE Report, 2009).
- About 44 million hectares of land in India are degraded due to salinity, alkalinity, acidity and waterlogging, compared to the net cultivated area of 142 MHa <u>http://www.moef.gov.in/soer/2009/SoE%20Report_2009.pdf</u>
- India world's largest groundwater user. 29% of GW blocks in semi-critical, critical or over-exploited categories - also, polluted with fertilisers & pesticides. Fifty-four percent of India's groundwater wells have declined over the past seven years, and 21 major cities are expected to <u>run out of groundwater by 2020</u>. The total estimated groundwater depletion in India is in the range of 122 to 199 billion cubic meters. Groundwater over-extraction leading to carbon emissions (2-7% of annual CO2 emissions)
- 70% of India's surface water polluted incl. from agro-chemicals
- Agro-diversity rapidly eroding
